Grand Canyon University launched the Canyon Christian Schools Consortium (CCSC) in January 2011 to offer parents a return on their investment for sending their children to a Christian high school. Today, CCSC provides unique benefits to more than 2,300 Christian schools globally, including your school.

CCSC has grown rapidly and continues to be a blessing for many the students looking to attend a Christian university. Over the years, GCU has worked hard to keep education at a private Christian university affordable. More students have been able to realize their goal of attending a Christian university where they can grow in their faith and make an impact for Christ. GCU has, in return, been blessed by the impact CCSC students have on campus and our surrounding community.

As the number of students receiving the CCSC Award continues to grow, university leadership is looking at the long-term impact of this increase while working to maintain affordable tuition. It's important to be mindful of the fact GCU has not increased tuition for the past 10 years while simultaneously investing over \$1 billion in campus improvement and upgrades. The hope is GCU can go many more years without an increase.

Beginning fall 2019, incoming students will receive \$4,000 for every year they attended a CCSC-participant high school if they live on campus. Students living off campus will receive \$1,500 for every year of attendance. Overall, the CCSC Award can be worth up to \$16,000 over eight semesters<sup>\*</sup>. The CCSC Award can be stacked with merit-based scholarships offered by GCU, which are based on a student's GPA, SAT or ACT scores.

GCU is committed to keeping costs low while providing a high-caliber academic experience that will help our students become leaders in their careers and community. We are thankful for the opportunity to continue to work with you in providing CCSC benefits to your school community.

\*Qualified students must have graduated from a GCU CCSC participant school, be enrolled for 12 or more credit hours for each semester, and be under the age of 21 by the start of the first semester at GCU. The scholarship awards \$4,000 per academic year to on-campus students who are admissible and \$1,500 per academic year to off-campus students. This award is renewable for each semester, as long as the student maintains continuous full-time enrollment, joins a campus worship service weekly and meets the 20-hour community service project each semester (AD hours per academic year), uploid the ethical and moral values by which GCU stants and maintains admissibility with GCU. Recipients of the CCSC award are ineligible for the Grand Canyon State Scholarship. This scholarship is subject to the Grand Canyon University CAP policy and cannot exceed your charges. Award and award amounts are based on the 2018-19 award year.
